Foster Parent Guidelines

The following guidelines have been approved by the Executive Board of the CCC:

- All CCC foster animals must be kept indoors at all times.
- If a CCC cat becomes sick while in the care of a Foster Parent, a member of the Executive Board or the Foster Parent Coordinator should be contacted immediately. Also, if one of your personal felines becomes sick, please also contact us immediately.
- If a CCC cat will be in a home with other indoor animals, those pets must be current on all their vaccinations. (Feline vaccinations include rabies, fvrpc and leukemia.)
- CCC foster cats must be isolated from other pets and not have physical contact. A bedroom or bathroom works well for this purpose. We'll also provide you with a wire pen if necessary.
- Please feel free to ask for supplies – food, litter, flea treatment medicine, etc. We'll be happy to give you whatever you need to make your fostering experience easy! You will also be reimbursed for such necessities if you purchase them yourself. Just mail your receipts with a quick note to our PO Box (attn: Mary H., Treasurer) and you'll receive a check in about a week.
- Except in cases of emergencies, a member of the Executive Board or Foster Parent Coordinator should be contacted regarding the need for veterinary care. The CCC regularly uses a few area veterinarians. If emergency occurs and the foster cat must be taken to the vet, only one of the following offices should be used unless otherwise authorized by a member of the Executive Board or the Foster Parent Coordinator. (If you live outside of Chico, please call us to see what veterinarians to use in your town.)
